## WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

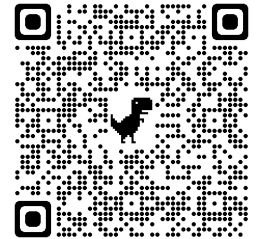
- Learning about relationship violence and consent can reduce said violence by 60%
